
Center for Scholarship on the Blessed Virgin Mary

Scope and Contents

Two volumes of letters and manuscripts written by "Michael", who never uses a last name: "Letters of Michael", a bound series of correspondence written by Michael dated 1943-1945, and "Love Letters for Mary", a manuscript written and printed by Michael in May 1944 for limited private distribution to his friends.

Scope and Contents

This collection contains correspondence, reports, publications, program details, and written materials related to the International Marian Research Insitute's (IMRI) African Marian Insitutes and seminars held in 1980. Publications include a pre-press version of "Mary in Faith and Life in the New Age of the Church". A large portion of the collection is comprised of correspondence of Fr. Theodore Koehler and the papers of Fr. William Cole, both of IMRI.

Scope and Contents

Contents include photostatic copies of the Lordes Medical Bureau case files for John Traynor and Francis Pascal (contents mostly in French), including full medical dossiers, pamphlets and photos; and a typed report by Prof. Michel-Marie Salmon summarizing the Case Files of Vittorio Micheli (written in English).

Unmarked and haphazardly sorted materials from period before an archivist was hired.

While frequently academic or theological in topic, many records include personal journals and correspondence.
